
## Vision & Mission

#### ADULT LITERACY & ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

We are proud to have served:

- 129 adult students during the 2022-2023 fiscal year (an increase of 18 students)
- 3,833.25 hours of instruction
- Sneak peek into 2024 to date: 225 adult students with 3,880.25 hours through January, 2024. Wow!!
